I am writing to formally object to the allocation of Site ID 307 in the Rugby Borough Council Proposed Submission Local Plan. I believe the inclusion of this site renders the plan unsound for the following reasons:

1. Severe Infrastructure Constraints (Not Effective)

Under the NPPF, a Local Plan must be effective and deliverable. Site 307 is served primarily by North Road, which is a narrow, rural lane with significant physical constraints.

The road width is insufficient to allow two-way flow for heavy goods vehicles (HGVs) or emergency service vehicles without mounting verges or endangering pedestrians.

The plan provides no evidence that a safe, compliant access point can be achieved without third-party land or significant destruction of the existing street scene and hedgerows.

Because the site cannot be safely accessed, it is not deliverable within the plan period.

2. Highway Safety and Sustainable Transport (National Policy NPPF Para 115)

The NPPF states that development should only be prevented or refused on highways grounds if there would be an unacceptable impact on highway safety.

North Road already serves as a key route for residents and farm machinery. Adding the cumulative traffic from Site 307 onto this narrow corridor creates a high risk of collisions. There is a lack of continuous, safe footways on North Road. Forcing additional pedestrians (including children) onto a road with narrow carriage-widths and no refuge is inconsistent with national policy regarding safe and sustainable transport.

3. Impact on Village Character (Not Justified)

The scale of development proposed for Site 307 is disproportionate to the capacity of the narrow lanes that define the character of North Road. The "urbanising" effect of the required highway widening (if even possible) would cause significant harm to the rural character of the village entrance.

Conclusion:

For the reasons stated above, Site ID 307 is physically unsuitable for the scale of development proposed. It should be removed from the Local Plan as it fails the tests of being Effective and Consistent with National Policy.

A much better plan than the proposed sites for Clifton upon Dunsmore, would be to allow the application south of Lilbourne road to progress. This development of 160 houses would contain all of the housing requirement for Clifton upon Dunsmore in a single location. The development would attract a CIL payment, which would be of significant benefit to the local community. As the developer is already seeking planning permission, this site could be developed quickly, contributing to the housing requirement for Rugby without any delay.
