Subject: Strong Objection to Proposed Wind Turbine Development Near Houlton and Redrow Estate

Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing as a deeply concerned and frustrated resident to **strongly and unequivocally object** to the proposed installation of additional wind turbines between Houlton and Clifton, as set out in the Proposed Submission Local Plan.

My name is **Tsz Hong Fung**, and I live at [REDACTED], on the Redrow estate. Like many families here, I chose to live in this area because of its open landscape, sense of space, and promise of a healthy, pleasant environment. This proposal threatens to destroy all of that.

The idea of placing **large industrial wind turbines so close to residential communities is completely unacceptable**. These structures will permanently scar the landscape and turn what is currently a peaceful, green area into an industrial zone. For residents of Redrow, this will be an unavoidable daily visual intrusion and a constant reminder that our quality of life has been sacrificed without our consent.

I am extremely concerned about the **inevitable reduction in property values**. Many residents have committed their life savings to homes here, trusting that the surrounding environment would be protected. This proposal would unfairly devalue our homes overnight, leaving residents to bear the financial consequences of a decision that benefits developers rather than the community.

The **impact on wildlife and the natural environment** cannot be ignored. These fields are home to birds and wildlife that will be displaced or harmed. It is deeply contradictory to claim environmental responsibility while approving developments that damage local ecosystems and biodiversity.

There are also very real **health, noise, and safety concerns**. Constant turbine noise, vibration, and shadow flicker can have serious effects on wellbeing, particularly for families with children and elderly residents. These fields are actively used by residents for walking and recreation, and introducing towering machinery with rotating blades presents unacceptable safety risks in areas used by the public.

Most importantly, I do not believe these turbines will **bring any real or direct benefit to the people of Rugby**. There is no guarantee of reduced energy costs, no clear community gain, and no meaningful local investment. Instead, local residents are expected to endure disruption, visual damage, and financial loss for benefits that appear to be purely commercial.

This proposal makes residents feel **ignored, undervalued, and powerless**, and it seriously undermines trust in the planning process. Development of this scale and impact should not be forced upon communities who clearly stand to lose far more than they gain.

For these reasons, I **completely reject** the proposed wind turbine development and urge the council to listen to local residents and protect our homes, our environment, and our quality of life.

I formally request a response confirming that my objection has been received and will be fully considered as part of this consultation.
