Wolvey is a small village – with very few public transport links. There are very few buses that travel through the village each day. There are very few buses that travel from Wolvey to Nuneaton and Coventry and none at all to the nearby town of Hinckley.

You need to have a car if you live in Wolvey, as there are very limited services – all of the main shops and services require a car journey to other towns and cities.

Wolvey is a very small remote village with modest accessibility and poor public transport links.

Wolvey has very limited services, and a car journey is needed to access higher quality services in other towns and cities. Therefore, large scale housing developments in the village should be removed as it would put more cars onto roads that are not suitable and cause dangerous conditions.

You can't live in Wolvey without having a car as you need to drive everywhere – there are very few buses that come through the village each day. The roads have been built for a small village settlement, and the village has no employment opportunities other than working in the pub, Drs surgery and village shop.

Children would have to be bused at cost to WCC to secondary schools out of the area. Nicholas Chamberlaine School will need to accommodate all of the extra places from all of the development that is taking place in nearby Bulkington.

All of the roads in Wolvey are inadequate for extra development, they are narrow windy country lanes, which would get congested and create dangerous road conditions. The road out of Wolvey (going towards Bulkington) has a series of dangerous blind bends and has many accidents per year caused by speeding drivers who are not used to these roads. Farming machinery and tractors are often travelling on these roads at slow speeds going to and from the farms in the area.

Wolvey is a small remote village unable to accommodate the level of growth proposed.

Please consider other more appropriate options in urban areas that are nearer to public transport links. Rugby and Coventry have all of these links and the services that people will need to access. Please also consider empty homes and bring these back into use.

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Wolvey shop is a small village store which has the basics, but you would not be able to do your weekly shop in there – again you need to use a car to travel to nearby larger supermarkets.

Wolvey has no dentist, chemist, or hospital – car journeys would need to be made to access these services

Wolvey has a Drs Surgery but this is only open on certain days for certain hours and requires car journeys to be made

The primary school is near capacity and would not be able to cope with another 70 children. The development that is taking place in Bulkington will put additional pressure on Wolvey School and Nicholas Chmberlaine will have to take additional children from the developments that are taking place in Bulkington.

Wolvey is a tiny remote village with limited facilities and limited public transport. It is not capable of supporting the scale of the development proposed.

The roads are windy, with dangerous bends and can be dangerous and often causes accidents for unsuspecting drivers who are not used to driving on these roads – they

also tend to flood badly at certain times of the year with run off from the fields. The roads already get congested at school drop and pick up times.

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There are better options – in other areas such as Coventry and Rugby which are nearer to public transport links. These areas have better services and facilities and are more easily accessible.

Please explore whether the areas above the town shops could be developed for accommodation and look at empty homes which can be brought back into use.

Wolvey should be removed from the draft plan as the infrastructure can't cope with what is being proposed. There is no evidence to show that it will be able to cope.

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The main rural settlements definition is not sound – Wolvey is the smallest and least well served of all the rural villages yet has the third highest housing allocation which is totally unfair.

Policy S1 is not sound and this can be supported by huge amounts of evidence.

The majority of new growth should be in the Rugby Urban Area and not in remote rural areas that have minimal services.

Wolvey should be in a lower category in the hierarchy because of its limited services, facilities, employment and public transport.

You can't live in Wolvey without having a car as you need to drive everywhere – there are very few buses that travel through the village each day.

The roads have been built for a small village settlement, and are inadequate for extra development, they are many narrow windy country lanes, which would get congested and create dangerous road conditions. The road around Wolvey Primary School already gets very congested at pick up and drop off times creating dangerous conditions and poor visibility for drivers.

The road out of Wolvey (going towards Bulkington) has a series of dangerous blind bends and has many accidents per year caused by speeding drivers who are not used to these country roads. Farming machinery and tractors are often travelling on the roads through Wolvey at slow speeds going to and from the farms in the area. This could create dangerous conditions if more cars are on the road.

The village has no employment opportunities for people other than working in the pub, Drs surgery and village shop.

Children would have to be bused at cost to Warwickshire County Council to secondary schools out of the area. Nicholas Chamberlaine School will also need to accommodate extra places from all of the development that is taking place in the nearby village of Bulkington. So that is a big concern.

Wolvey is a small remote village unable to accommodate the level of growth proposed.

Wolvey has very limited services - with only a small shop with post office, pub and Doctors surgery. Extra development will put extra pressure on these already limited services.

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Policy S2 is not sound – the development is not sustainable in a small remote village and the evidence shows that it is not justified or fair.

The Policy does not reflect the overall preferred strategy of Urban Concentration and has proposed 58% of new allocations (over other and previous Local Plans) in rural areas.

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More growth and development should be directed to the urban areas around Rugby and Coventry with a reduction in Wolvey and other small rural areas that do not have the infrastructure or facilities.

There are other areas that are more favourable in terms of their sustainability and strategic location.

The Council has identified large areas of Green Belt and reclassified it as Grey Belt – these areas must be protected to safeguard the countryside from encroachment

Rugby Council’s Draft Local Plan wishes to allocate 1,500 new homes on land that would need to be released from the established Green Belt. How does this protect this valuable green belt land for future generations?

It is crucial that other development options outside of the Green Belt should be explored. Developers are taking the easy option by developing on the greenbelt, it is too easy for developers to concrete over greenbelt fields as opposed to other areas – the green belt is easier to prepare as a blank canvas which means more profit for the developers.

There are hundreds of empty homes in Warwickshire and across the UK and emphasis should be put on bringing these homes back into use again rather than building new ones, especially in the greenbelt.

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Rugby Council's own Sustainability Policy Appraisal indicates that 'Wolvey is a notably small main rural settlement with a low settlement score. This score indicates that Wolvey offers fewer services, facilities and transport links compared to other higher ranked settlements.

The proposed development is in the Greenbelt which should only be developed in exceptional cases. This development is not for exceptional reasons and is contrary to Government policy.

Previous landscape studies have stated that the land is highly sensitive to housing development.

Development would put huge amounts of pressure on the village school, GP surgery and very limited public transport and children would need to be bused at cost to secondary schools out of the area.

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Alternative sites should be looked at in other areas in urban areas of Rugby and Coventry, and the issue of empty homes should be investigated further to bring many more of these homes back into use. This needs to be looked at before building on greenbelt land.

There is often farming machinery and tractors on the roads on the Coventry Road, which can be dangerous if there are lots of cars on the roads. These roads were never built to sustain large amounts of vehicles.

Land north of B4109 should not be developed –

150 homes are completely disproportionate to the size of the small village of Wolvey

The development is within the greenbelt which is contrary to Government policy

150 new homes and possibly up to 210 is too much for the infrastructure and few services in the village

Previous landscapes have indicated that the land is high sensitivity to development

Rugby Council have scored Wolvey as having a low settlement score in their Sustainability Appraisal
