The development of this site is contrary to the Settlement Hierarchy Policy 1.16 which seeks to restrict development outside main settlement boundaries. The Policy map would indicate that the development is located outside the main settlement boundary.

The Sustainability Appraisal (SA) identifies east Coventry as not having good transport links and site 315 was categorised as being weak regarding accessibility and connectivity. Policy I 1B, i (Transport) seeks to locate development to mitigate the use of car travel. Given the sites weak connectivity car use will be encouraged, and development of the sites does not meet this policy objective.

Under the Settlement Hierarchy, S1.15 settlements should be directed to locations with good services. Given the sites poor connectivity identified in the SA, this site represents a poor choice and does not fully implement Ruby Borough Councils development policy.

The SA makes no reference to the proposed access on to Heath Lane, particularly as in part this lane is a single carriageway country lane, with no foot patch or lighting and is widely used by both pedestrians and horse riders. Allowing car access on to the single carriageway section of Heath Lane will increase the safety risk to pedestrians and horse riders, contrary to Policy I (Transport) 1B, ii, iii and iiiii.

Upon accessing Heath Lane from the proposed site, at the top of Heath Lane car users have the opportunity to follow this road which becomes a normal carriageway or turn into Green Lane to access Coventry. Green Lane is a single carriageway provided with no footpath, and limited lighting. Any increase in traffic will put pedestrians and horse riders at risk on Green Lane, contrary to Policy I 1 (Transport) B, ii, iii, and iiiii.

The lower section of Heath Lane is a normal road which allows cars to simultaneous pass in opposite directions. While the road is provided with a footpath it diverts from one side to the other side of the road. Any increased traffic from the development will increase safety risks for pedestrians who have to cross this road to maintain their presence on the footpath. Policy objective I (Transport) 1B, ii, iii, and iiiii have not been fully considered given increased risks to pedestrians. In addition, Heath Lane is equipped with extremely large grass vergers and any increase in traffic using this section of health Lane will increase the risk to children who use the grass verge as a play area.

Access on to the single carriageway section of Heath Lane from site 315 is via a sunken road and no consideration has been given to this historical asset and its proposed destruction, contrary to policy D4 (Design) (Historical Environment) paragraph C and policy EN2 Landscape Protection. In addition, the SA makes no mention of the badger set situated in the embankment of the sunken road. Breaching the sunken road will impact biodiversity contrary to policy EN1 A.

While the plan makes reference to exploring and contributing to opportunities to enhance a safe pedestrian and cycle way on an existing bridle path between Brinklow and Brandon, it has not considered extending or providing new paths to connect strategic employment sites at Ansty and Ryton to reduce reliance upon cars and erase the burden on an area that already has poor connectivity.

To maintain the safety of pedestrians and other users of the highway:

the site should not be provided with vehicle access on to Heath Lane so as to meet Policy objective I (Transport) 1B, ii, iii, and iiiii.

all traffic should enter and exit this site via the Rugby Road entrance to meet Policy objective I (Transport) 1B, ii, iii, and iiiii.

any access on to Heath Lane should be pedestrian access only to meet Policy objective I (Transport) 1B, ii, and vi.

To maintain the sunken road, biodiversity and to fulfil policy D4 (Design) (Historical Environment) paragraph C and policy EN1 and 2 Biodiversity and Landscape Protection the site should not be provided with vehicle access on to Heath Lane.

New pedestrian and cycle routes to connect the site to Strategic Employment sites should be considered

The rear access on to the single carriageway section of Heath Lane from site 315 is via a sunken road and no consideration has been given to this historical asset and its proposed destruction, contrary to policy D4 (Design) (Historical Environment) paragraph C and policy EN2 Landscape Protection.

While the plan refers to exploring and contributing to opportunities to enhance a safe pedestrian and cycle way on an existing bridle path between Brinklow and Brandon, it has not considered extending or providing new paths to connect strategic employment sites at Ansty and Ryton.
