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Through the work of the A5 Partnership RBC will be aware there are capacity issues on the A5. NBBC has allocated sites reliant on the A5 as does neighbouring authority, North Warwickshire Borough Council. National funding for A5 is still to be decided, the uncertainty is captured in the supporting RBC/WCC STA. NBBC supports the overall housing and employment strategy that avoids allocating sites off the A5, however the accumulative impacts will need to be considered with the STA.
