2) Generally between Rugby and Brownsover and Newton.

Rugby Borough Council stated:

Area 2: **“The area extends from the M6 motorway in the north to Newton Manor Lane in the south. The Area of Restraint in this locality maintains a physical separation between the village of Newton and the housing and employment allocations at Coton. The land rises gently to the west and forms a hill crest to the east of the allocations thus visually separating Newton from future development and maintaining the urban form of Rugby.”**

In conclusion, Rugby Borough Council added:

“It is not considered appropriate that development should take place within the defined areas due to their contribution to the urban form and structure of Rugby. Land has only been included within the Area of Restraint where there are clear and justifiable reasons for doing so; for example where there is a need to ensure the integrity of fringe villages, to safeguard the open approaches to the Town or to protect important “green wedges” within or on the edge of the urban area. The Borough Council is of the opinion that the boundaries as defined achieve this aim.”

The defining of Areas of Restraint / Separation between Boughton Vale, Brownsover and Newton were put in place to prevent urban creep from joining villages like Newton and absorbing them to Rugby. The reason for providing this protection is just as valid today as in earlier times and the threat to Newton’s identity is very real.
